April 2nd deadline for 2012 Colorado Press Association \$500 High School Newspaper Adviser Internships

Would you like to spend two weeks during the summer of 2012 at a newspaper in your community — and be paid for the experience?

If you are a high school teacher or a professional school staff member who serves as the adviser to your high school's newspaper, you are invited to apply for a Colorado Press Association High School Adviser Internship. Up to five advisers will be selected to participate in an internship. Participants will receive a \$500 stipend at the conclusion of the two-week internship.

The internship, which is endorsed by the Colorado High School Press Association Board of Directors, is designed to give high school newspaper advisers the opportunity to meet with publishers, editors, advertising directors, and production managers to discuss news coverage, ad sales, technology, page design and editing.

Some interns spend their two weeks in one department — newsroom or advertising, for example — and others spend time in a number of the newspaper's departments.

To Apply

Submit the following items in one packet to The Denver Foundation:

- a cover letter that explains your experience with scholastic journalism and describes what you would hope to gain from an internship
- completed Application Form
- current resume

Application packets must be postmarked by **Monday, April 2, 2012**. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered. A letter or email will be sent to all applicants on or before May 8th regarding the Selection Committee's decisions.
